Unit 1 - Introduction to Child Care

3 days

In this unit, students will:

- -Investigate the necessity for and purpose of quality group care for young children
- -Students demonstrate their competence when they:
- -Identify trends that impact child care
- -Differentiate among the various types of quality child care programs
- -Point out the historical contributions that have influenced how child care services are currently provided

Unit 2 - Center Environment

4 days

In this unit, students will ...

- -Illustrate factors that affect space organization such as program goals, group size, licensing rules, etc.
- -Identify trends that impact child care
- -Differentiate among the various types of quality child care programs
- -Point out the historical contributions that have influenced how child care services are currently provided

Unit 3 - The Children

1 week

In this unit, students will ...

- -Discriminate among the varying stages of child development
- -Students demonstrate their competence when they:
- -Identify developmentally appropriate practice for each age
- -Differentiate among physical, intellectual, social, emotional, and moral development

Unit 4 - Center Environment

1 week

In this unit, students will ...

- -Analyze techniques of positive guidance for interacting with young children
- -Students demonstrate their competence when they:
- -Identify appropriate behavioral limits for a child based on the developmentally appropriate practice

- -Cite resources for positive guidance when caring for children
- -Cite state licensing rules related to guiding children
- -Identify strategies for handling behavioral issues
- -Adhere to licensing guidelines related to sanitation, health, and safety for children ages birth to 3.
- -Follow center's daily safety and sanitation procedures (hand washing, diapering, disposal, meals, etc.)
- -Identify common signs and symptoms of illness in children and respond appropriately
- -Inspect the safety of indoor and outdoor space, furniture and equipment

Unit 5 - Activities/Curriculum

3 weeks

In this unit, students will ...

- -Select developmentally appropriate activities, equipment, and materials for children
- -Writing learning objectives
- -Identifying materials needed
- -Creating developmentally appropriate lesson plans for the age

Unit 6- Professional Development

3 days

In this unit, students will ...

- -Explore career advancement opportunities within child care services
- -Identify the roles and functions of individuals engaged in early childhood, education, and services
- -Analyze opportunities for employment
- -Summarize education and training requirements and opportunities for career paths in child care services
- -Explain the role of professional organizations in education and early childhood

Unit 7- Food and Nutrition

3 days

In this unit, students will ...

- Apply the USDA dietary guidelines for children and infants
- -Identify the nutritional needs of children
- -Describe safety modifications of food choices for children of different ages and abilities
- -Explain modifications for children with special dietary needs and restrictions
- -Explain procedures for food safety, storage, preparation and handling

Unit 8 - Health and Safety

1 week

In this unit, students will ...

- -Identify center responsibilities related to health and safety of children
- -Relate the WI licensing rules and regulations
- -Identify first aid, emergency, sanitary and routine care procedures

- -Obtain SIDS training
- -Obtain the Shaken Baby Syndrome certification
- -Obtain Child Abuse prevention training

Unit 9 - Special Needs

3 days

In this unit, students will ...

- -Identify modifications needed for children with special needs
- -Students demonstrate their competence when they:
- -Explain the need for inclusive programming
- -Identify specific modifications for special needs children

Unit 10 - Appropriate Communication

1 week

In this unit, students will ...

- -Communicate effectively with parents and other staff members regarding children ages birth to 3.
- -Participate in recordkeeping requirements
- -Explain the importance of communication with parents during drop off and pick up
- -Develop written communication to inform parents of center activities
- -Maintain confidentiality
- -Demonstrate empathy
- -Use language and style suitable to audiences and purposes
- -Use bias free language
- -Listen responsively

Unit 11 - Infant Toddler Center Settings

1 week

In this unit, students will ...

- -Apply appropriate practice related to the social-emotional development of children ages birth to 3.
- -Promote a safe, comfortable environment where infants and toddlers can thrive
- -Use activities that stimulate social/emotional development
- -Demonstrate nurturing behaviors
- -Apply routines effectively
- -Are responsive to behavioral cues (comforting techniques, attachment behaviors, reducing stranger anxiety, etc.
